FAMILY INFORMATION AFTERNOON



Thank you to everyone who joined the Family Information Afternoon on Literacy in the Early Years. It was a wide ranging and enjoyable discussion. We started with an overview of literacy and explored the topic by sharing examples of children's drawings, writing and their stories.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION



Over the last few weeks we have been practising our emergency evacuation procedure. Children have learned that when the bell is rung, they stop what they are doing and go "straight to the gate" From there, staff lead children to the hall where a roll is taken.

CONSTRUCTION

Thank for looking after Butterfly in the past. She is all better.


We have something digging a hole into the chicken coop. We don't know what it is.



The children have speculated and theorised:




Sean thinks "it's a burrowing cockroach"

Group 1 News

Group 1 have been travelling around the world! It has taken us to many different countries so far and have lead us to explore many different ways of life - particularly for children around the world.

Our *Personal Passports* have been helping us reflect on the countries we have visited, whilst also exploring different aspects of ourselves.



Games around the world!

Over the past few weeks we have happily welcomed many guest families and parents into our learning environment to share different games or aspects of culture from around the world. We have been loving the collaboration that has occurred during the early weeks of exploring this theme.

Travelling to Africa, we welcomed Georgie in to explore Mancala - a traditional African game. A complex number and strategy-based game using simple objects (in this instance, beads), requiring each participant to explore and plan for the movement of their beads to their home collection area. Georgie also returned to teach us the complex dice rolling game of 10,000 - another number and strategy-based game involving the rolling of 5 dice. These games are continually being revisited, thanks Georgie!





We also welcomed Karthi and mother and father-in-law in to further explore the country of India. We learnt about traditional dress, Bindis, a delicious Indian sweet treat (Payasam), as well as an odds/evens game traditionally played by children in India. Thank you Karthi!









We were very happy to have Pete in for all things touch footy. We explored different warm up and cool down drills, exploring our hand eye coordination as we learnt more about the basics of a very Australian sporty of touch footy. Thanks for the insights and touch footy session Pete!





During this week's exploration of Japan, discussions led us to dive into the world of sumo wrestling. Fran, a resident wrestling expert offered to come and join Group 1 for an explanation and trial of wrestling. Before we began, a whole group discussion was had about respect, knowing our limitations and communication and the role that these skills play within the art of wrestling. The children were very keen to participate as they chose their wrestling partner and enjoyed the benefits of this unique style of physical exertion and self-discipline. Many requests have been made to revisit some further wrestling sessions with Fran.
