### GOULBURN YURT FARM SKILLS COURSE Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> December 2019

Want your kids to learn more life skills? Want to get them away from technology?





After 30 years running "Back to Basics" camps on the Yurt Farm we are now offering a more structured "Skills Course" including a range of activities that will be fun and will prepare your child with basic living skills for life.

Designed mainly for children aged 7 – 13yrs, this course is available to be conducted at the Yurt Village on the farm, 15 minutes West of Goulburn.

Eight activities are taught in rotation. These could include: safe fire lighting, simple leatherwork, basic woodwork skills using hammer and nails, wood carving, painting with a brush, digging with a shovel, craft activities using wool, tools from the tool box, basic cooking skills – make flour by grinding wheat for making damper and make billy tea, learn how to plait a stockwhip and bush mechanics.

A Certificate of Accomplishment will be provided on completion.

Future courses will be conducted on the last Sunday of every month throughout 2020. Variation to the program may include new and different skills such as – kite making, introduction to tennis, introduction to guitar playing with learning 3 chords and a song, how to tell a story and mudbrick making
