It is always such a joy to learn with the pre-high students as part of the transition program at Kinma. Transition is yet another facet of life at Kinma. Change is a definite in life so we may as well build its existence into our plans. How do we support our students who are making changes?

As many of you are aware, some of our pre-schoolers are transitioning to group 1 and some of our Primary students are moving to different groups. Those who are not moving are engaged in leadership roles of welcoming new friends into their groups. One example of this is in group 1, where all the children who are welcoming leaders are designing learning pods for their new friends. In these, the children consider an activity they enjoy and one they think their new friends may likewise enjoy. There are drawing and writing pods, there are constructing and designing ones, there are messy and artistic varieties, mainly indoor and a couple outdoors. All in all, the visiting new group 1ers (as they are called) get a lovely taste of experiences, engaging with their new friends. There is a warm buzz as one moves around the space. Essentially, the children get to know their space for next year, the friends with whom they will be sharing it and meet teachers.

Part of transition includes our group 3ers, who are leaving to move on to high school in 2016, having some separate time. We do some sample lessons; with a range of different styled teachers, we taste algebra- year 7 style (as you may be unaware that our group 1ers start algebra, unknowingly), we wonder about and explore facets of high school life and we write speeches for the farewell concert ( which hopefully all of you have booked in your diaries- Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> December) . We (ahhh ...the royal we) also try to figure out what the farewell song will be. It's a tradition for the Primary children to sing a farewell song to the Pre Highs and with all efforts to keep the song a secret..... they always manage to figure it out!

This year's pre high students are Owen, Asher, Izzi and Giacomo. They are heading to three different high schools, which you will no doubt hear about as they share their different farewell presentations. Feel free to wish them a kindly few words if you see them over the next couple of weeks. You may remember the feeling of moving from primary to high, a few years ago (maybe a few more than a few) .... The mixture of excitement, joy, trepidation, nervousness and sadness ( leaving Kinma) would be such a different one for each. A gentle word from a person or two may be appreciated?

The coming weeks are so full of amazing experiences. As Julie C wrote last week , please do take the time to check the dates and times as your children will be only thrilled if you are able to share in one or more of the activities as your timetables allow. Also supporting your children with what they need for each different experience would be really helpful.

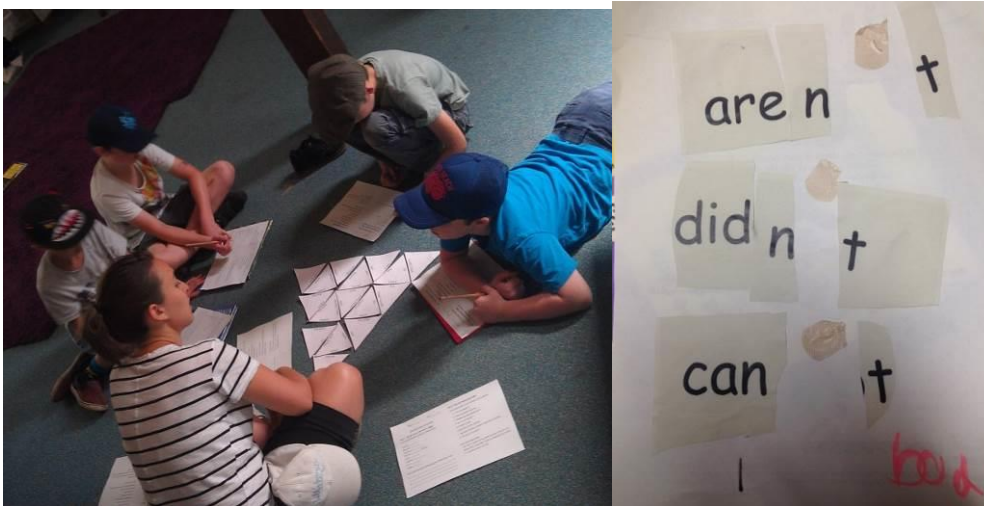
Please bear in mind these are “works in progress”; the children have put an enormous amount of effort and energy into their projects and are still in the process of developing their communities.

Hi all,

You would hardly realise we’re drawing to the end of the year in Group 2, as we are still chugging along at full throttle! Here’s a round-up of what we’ve been up to.

The most recent addition to our English Toolbox has been “contractions” – how do we make them, what do they mean and how do we spell them? We carried out some contraction surgery, using a scalpel to remove parts of words and stitching them back together with a scar (apostrophe).

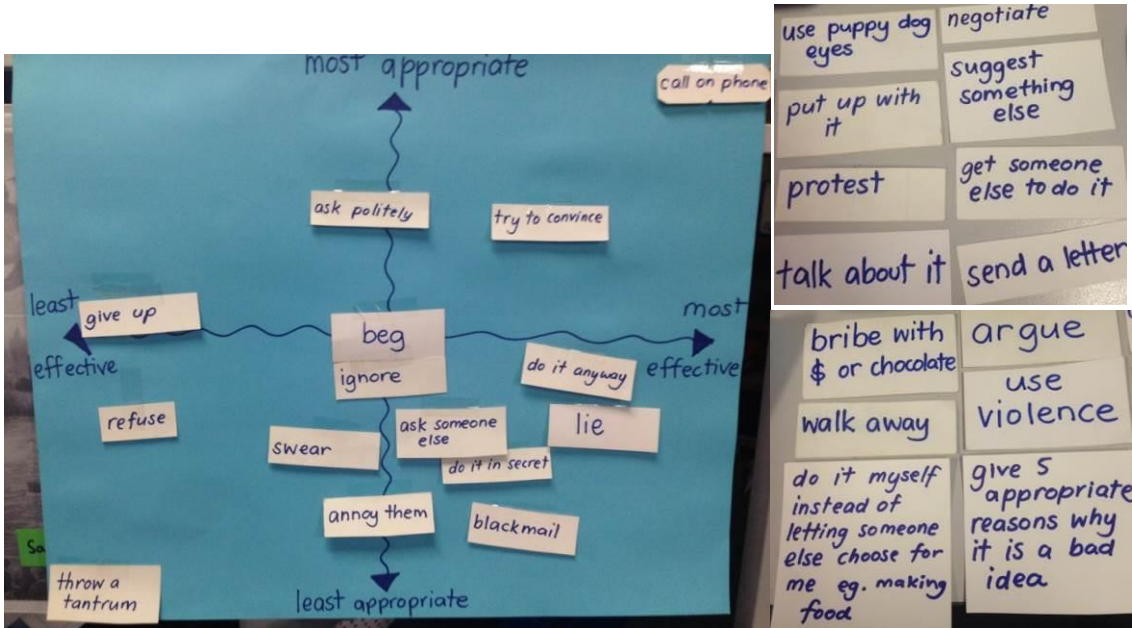


We have also been continuing with our study of the Lorax. Here is a letter that the children wrote to the Once-ler. This letter was written as a “joint construction” with children coming up with ideas and a teacher helping them to weave them together and scribe. We often use this strategy when introducing a new text type to children to model how to apply the appropriate structural and linguistic conventions of that particular text. Beware, this letter was all about building a convincing argument... They may try this at home!

Address your reader	Dear Once-ler,
<b>Introduction</b>	
☺ What is the issue?  ☺ Clearly state your opinion	There are some very serious problems with you cutting down all of the Truffula trees. In my opinion you are being very inconsiderate of nature and I can feel the pain of the trees. I strongly believe that you must stop chopping down the trees.
<b>Arguments</b>	
Reason	Most importantly, the Truffula trees are not owned by you, they are part of nature.
Details/example	You are doing something illegal.
Reason	Another reason you must stop chopping down the trees is because you are eradicating the animals.
Details/example	For instance, the Swoomee Swans can't sing because of the smog and they can't lay their eggs in the trees.
Reason	In addition, you are not reproducing trees after you have cut them down.
Details/example	For example, you could just chop a bit of the tree off so it could regrow, or you could collect the Truffula seeds and plant more trees.
<b>Conclusion</b>	
☺ Clearly restate you opinion  ☺ Clearly state what you need your reader to do	I will tell you once more, I feel extremely disappointed that you are cutting down all the trees and you must stop it this instant!
Sign off	Yours sincerely, the disappointed Lorax

EAs a follow on from the Lorax, we have also been considering the range of options we have when somebody makes a decision, or does something that affects us... but that we don't agree with. We have participated in some very frank and enlightening conversations where the children have shared their ideas on the matter. The children came up with a vast array of possible actions (white and blue cards below) that they can/do/consider taking from time to time. We arranged our thoughts on this chart to show that sometimes the most effective option can be the least appropriate or the most appropriate the least effective or any combination of this spectrum. We are yet to decide where to place the options on the right of the photo. We continued to explore these ideas through drama, as requested by Ali.





In our communities project we have... run out of money! So we have been using our convincing and letter writing skills to write letters to the government to ask for more money to build our houses. Once our grants were approved and cheques signed, construction got underway!



In other news... The sand pit has been a great place of play over the last few weeks. We have also been working on repairing the tee pee.



In class meeting this week it was decided that Group 2 would run **Secret Santa** again this year, with a few parameters:

- ☺ \$5 spending limit with a goal to not spend any money and give hand-made or second hand/recycled items (e.g. friendship band, drawing, jokes/riddles, write them a poem or story; find something at home that you no longer need eg. stationery or a book – check with a parent first...)
- ☺ No bought food
- ☺ Any home-made food to be nut free
- ☺ Everybody has to **make** a card to give to their person (we will have time to do this at school)
- ☺ Children hide gifts in each other's pigeon holes at school.

We will reveal all on the last day of school. Please don't feel pressured to BUY a gift for your child to give, we have emphasised to the class that this is a very busy/expensive time of year for families and that hand-made gifts (which can be made at school) are preferable.



It was also decided in class meeting that we would have a **Lorax dress up day**. Children decided it would be a fairly informal affair, with people joining in by choice and dressing up as a character from the Lorax. This will happen on Tuesday in the last week of school (15<sup>th</sup> Dec).

Last but not least we have some good byes and well wishes for our children transitioning to Group 3 in term 1 next year...
