Roadways and Car parking

Because the road outside the School is narrow and busy with cars and buses, there is a one way system in force between the hours of 8.30am -9.30am and 2.30pm - 3.30pm. Between these times, please enter through the bottom of Coolowie Road and exit up the hill.

Dear Kinma community,

Many of the highlights of the Friendship Day held annually at Kinma are what we may call the Imbetween moments: those special times among children when friendship blossoms in unexpected ways and each child takes steps in their learning. Over the coming weeks you will hear these seep into conversations at home, we will gather them through formal reflections and also listen to the stories as they come into our space.

Our greatest privilege as teachers, is watching some of those little moments as the seeds are laid. These priceless moments are what a gardener Sees when that first tiny hint of a seed sprouts, what an artist may feel as a concept or design fuses in mind or body. Today we watched children approach people they did not know and sense the discomfort of silence and wait and move through it; we watched this on a basketball court, making friendship bands, bushwalking, chatting, sharing food and perhaps most boldly and strikingly, from those who tried ad lib interviewing on stage in front of 11 visiting school communities.

How many of you have I spoken to over the years who have sung of one of the greatest joys you have at Kinma being the witnessing of your children find their voice, not only the physical sound it makes but the power to speak what they feel; to be who they are and at some point to do so before others. Firstly, in a safe space where they have built trust, possibly with one friend, one teacher, one class and ever so gradually they spread their wings to newer shores. Many of you have shared over the years that you yourselves do not have some of these skills, how thrilled you are to see your children have the opportunity to live into them at Kinma.

Today was a day when we were gifted many such Imbetween moments. I have watched so many years of these moments and never do I cease to be amazed at the magic being woven. When visiting families, staff and principals comment on our pre highs, all four of them and pinpoint facets of each throughout the day, it is affirming of the spreading wings stage. They point to their confidence, their comfort in being in their shoes, in laughing with abandon at school, in speaking openly with their teachers, of questioning that about which they unsure, of supporting younger children, even of taking steps to fix that which they see as challenges. We share this with you our families so you too can share in the joy.





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Group Two News


"I like solving problems," said Fiona.



Replace the name 'Fiona' in the excerpt above with 'Group 2' and the name 'Mr Brainfright' with 'Aimelyn, Tristan and Kimberley' and you a have a snapshot of a session of Maths Problem Solving in Group 2! Group 2 was presented with this exact brain teasing problem on Tuesday. The children were free to record their solutions to this perplexing puzzle as they wished.


Kate and Isobel chose to record part of their solution through drawing. In their drawing the man is thinking through the combinations of things he can leave together.



Aidan chose to record his solution through both drawing and writing.



Hunter chose to record his solution through symbols and text. He also developed his solution into a narrative.





Some used objects, found around our classroom, to represent each character and model the problem. Fifi and Nate used coloured unifix blocks and Reuben and Toby chose to use plasticine.

Group 2 were not short on creative solutions to this man's problem some included 'tying the animals to a tree' (Ali and Mika), 'building a bridge to cross the river' (Ellie), 'digging a hole for the wolf' (Fitch) and 'throwing the cabbage across to the other side' (Turiee).

The teachers also requested that the children observe their minds at work and were intrigued to know, "What kind of questions or feelings came up when you got stuck in the process? In our discussion these thoughts came up:

- "I don't know where to start?"
- "I don't really understand it? It's confusing."
- "There's too many steps?!"
- "I don't know how to organise my thoughts?"
- "Rethink the problem or start again but don't give up!"

Group 2 should be commended for their enthusiasm and resilience in trying to solve this brainteaser! You too can try to solve this problem and then share what you came up with someone in Group 2. We'll be immersed in more problem solving sessions this term so be prepared for your mind to be boggled!


At the beginning of the day when asked what friendship means, Mia said, "It is about making connections." This is exactly what we saw, heard and felt today.

Snack Attack has been a part of Kinma for a very long time...and how wonderful for the children to have their parents come in and fill the air with a good home-cooked meal. There have been some amazing foods and traditional goodies that parents have become loved and famous for.

There are 64 children in the Primary and 28 in Preschool, approx. 10 adults on Wednesdays.
