THALIS FOR SNACK ATTACK

We used two banana leaves from Kay's garden to make thalis (plates) for our Snack Attack lunch.





First we decided which piece of the leaf we were going to cut and then what size and shape it was going to be. Then we used and practised our skill with scissors, concentrating and focusing on the cutting and making sure everyone was safe.

All the thalis were then washed and carefully dried to make them clean and ready to use. We talked about what might be on the leaves and what might have walked on the leaves. We used two hands to hold our thalis while the food was being served and we walked carefully to our place to eat. Vegetarian or meat sausages, bread and salad vegetables for everyone – delicious!

And no washing up – just tear your thali into strips and put in the compost!

Learning about composting and reusing. An experience from another culture. Using vocabulary from other languages – Hindi and Tamil. Practising cutting skills. Thinking and making decisions. Creating a real and useful item.

We are all settling in well!





Phase 2 Sound Mat


